This policy is fully supported by the committee who are responsible for the implementation and review of this policy. Therefore we will adhere to the following:

- a) Take responsibility for setting and upholding standards and values that apply throughout the club at every level, so sailing can be enjoyed by everyone who wants to participate.
- b) Demonstrate a commitment to eliminating discrimination by reason of age, gender, gender reassignment, sexual orientation, race, nationality, ethnic origin, religion or belief, ability or disability and to encourage equal opportunities and an inclusive welcoming environment.
- c) Ensure that members, non-members and visitors are treated fairly and with respect and ensure that all members of the community regardless of their ability have access to and opportunities to take part in, and enjoy its programmes of activities, competitions and events.
- d) Oppose all forms of harassment, bullying or abuse towards an individual or group whether it is physical, verbal or online that is based on any of the characteristics listed above or for any other reason. Any incidents of this or a similar nature will be treated seriously and subjected to the appropriate disciplinary process.
- e) Ensure there is an immediate investigation of any complaints of discrimination on the above grounds, once they are brought to the attention of the Holy Loch Sailing Club SCIO welfare and safeguarding officer. Complaints will be dealt with in accordance with the complaints policy and, where such a complaint is upheld, the committee may impose such sanctions as it considers appropriate and proportionate to the discriminatory behaviour.
- f) Promote a culture that encourages the learning and development of coaches and volunteers in order to achieve greater diversity and inclusion within water activities, in compliance with the RYA Equality, Diversity and inclusion policy.
- g) Be committed and take action to create an inclusive environment that is welcoming and seeks to improve representation across all groups and participation at all levels within water sport activities.

Lodging a Complaint or incident: In the event that any employee, member, volunteer, visitor feels that he, she or they have suffered discrimination or harassment in any way or that the policies, rules or code of conduct have been broken they should follow the procedures below.

1. The complainant or incident should report the matter in writing or Email (<a href="mailto:safeguarginghlsc@gmail.com">safeguarginghlsc@gmail.com</a>) to the welfare and safeguarding officer or another member of the management committee.

The report should include:

- a) details of what occurred
- b) details of when and where the occurrence took place
- c) any witness details and copies of any witness statements
- d) names of any others who have been treated in a similar way (provided that those people consent to their names being disclosed)
- e) details of any former complaints made about the incident, including the date and to whom such complaint was made
- f) an indication as to the desired outcome.
